





'The Flying Nun:' 'It Was Just Drivel!'

"I was in heaven, learning as much as I could learn. I loved, loved, loved every minute of it," Sally Field once enthused to a writer from "O, The Oprah Magazine."

High praise for Sally's time spent as "The Flying Nun?" Actually, no. Field was waxing nostalgic about her first television series, "Gidget," a 1965 show on ABC-TV based on the Sandra Dee movie of the same name. (In 1959, "Gidget" had kicked off the beach party/ surfing film craze of the early 1960s.)

Sally's remembrance of her "Flying Nun" years was quite different. She had landed the "Gidget" role right out of Birmingham High School in the Los Angeles suburb of Van Nuys, shortly after she was spotted by a casting agent at an acting workshop. When "Gidget" folded after a year of mediocre ratings, Field was devastated. She was then offered the lead role in another ABC-TV series, this time as a Puerto Rico-based Catholic sister who could soar through the air. ("The Flying Nun" was based on Tere Rios's 1965 book "The Fifteenth Pelican.") Sally rejected the role, later explaining, "The show just made no sense to me. It was just drivel! There wasn't any piece of it that had human behavior in it."

Her stepfather was a stuntman/ actor named Jock Mahoney, who Sally found intimidating and controlling. When Mahoney warned her, "If you don't take this part, you may never work again," Sally capitulated and signed to play the cartoonish sister. When she later requested more depth to the "Nun" scripts, Field was told, "[People] want to know what they're going to see before they see it. They don't want to be touched. They don't want to be surprised. They don't want to think."

The series ran for three years — from 1967 to 1970 — for a total of 82 episodes. It quickly became a rating winner, but as the weekly stories unfolded, viewership dropped steadily. By the third year, the show was on life support. In the meantime, Sally had married her first husband, Steve Craig, and was pregnant during the last season's filming. ("You can only imagine what a pregnant flying nun looked like. I was a walking sight gag.") The show's producers used props and scenery to block the view of Field's body below the

But eventually, Sally came to realize that the time she spent on "The Flying Nun" did, to her surprise, have an actual upside. "Something in me started to take care of myself in a way that I hadn't been able to before," she said later. "I started to change and heal. I grew up and moved out of the fog. And ultimately, the experience of being on the series gave me tremendous strength. It made me want to be a real actor, no matter what."

She certainly achieved that goal. In her superlative movie career, Sally Field carried home an armful of Tinseltown trophies, including two Academy Awards for Best Actress for "Norma Rae" and "Places in the Heart."





"It's horrible. It's white bread, it's 'cute-ums."

Sammy Davis, Jr., couldn't imagine singing lyrics that included such cloying phrases as "groovy lemon pies." But Davis was being pressured to record "*The Candy Man*" by both his manager and Mike Curb, the 26-year-old hotshot president of MGM Records.

Curb was convinced that the song had "hit" written all over it — but only if done by Sammy. Before he approached the legendary vocalist, Curb recruited his 16-member recording group —the Mike Curb Congregation — to tape a childlike background for "The Candy Man."

Now if only Davis could be convinced to lay down a vocal track ...

As a member of the legendary Rat Pack, Sammy had earned celebrity by performing for sophisticated adult audiences. Was he willing to risk his reputation now by recording a featherweight kiddie ditty?

"Willie Wonka and the Chocolate Factory" was the classic 1971 movie based on the 1964 book "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory" by children's writer Roald Dahl. In Dahl's novel, the main character is Charlie Bucket, who, along with four other juveniles, visits

a candy factory owned by the eccentric chocolatier Willie Wonka (played to perfection by Gene Wilder).

British entertainment partners Anthony Newley and Leslie Bricusse had created the music for the film's soundtrack. The first tune heard is "The Candy Man." Sung by actor Aubrey Woods as the neighborhood candy-store owner named Bill, the shopkeeper enthusiastically extols the magical properties of Wonka's seductive sweets:

"Who can take a sunrise, sprinkle it with dew

"Cover it with chocolate and a miracle or two?

"The Candy Man, Oh, the Candy Man can

"The Candy Man can 'cause he mixes it with love

"And makes the world taste good."

Woods did a serviceable job on the tune, but Newley hated the rather stiff rendition and felt that Woods's version could easily doom a potential hit single. Newley decided to record his own interpretation, but Mike Curb got the jump on him.

Eventually, Sammy capitulated, still fearing that this could become a regrettable decision. Focused on a forthcoming trip to Vietnam to entertain the troops, he hurried through

"The Candy Man" in two takes. When he listened to the playback in the recording studio, Davis moaned, "This record is going straight into the toilet, and it may just pull my whole career down with it."

To his amazement (but not Curb's), the single caught the nation's ear when music fans of all ages embraced the joy that Davis offered here. "The Candy Man" shot to No. 1 on "Billboard's" chart and even earned a Grammy nomination.

In time, the 45 topped playlists worldwide. "There are lots of regional hits, but rarely does a record become an international hit," Davis explained later, probably with a smile and perhaps a slight feeling of guilt. "With a 5% royalty, I made half a million dollars."

"Who can take tomorrow, dip it in a dream

"Separate the sorrow and collect up all the cream?

"The Candy Man. Oh, the Candy Man can."



SR: What did you learn from writing the book?



SR: What is your education?A: Ithaca College, Brooklyn College graduate school.

Q: Career aspirations as a kid? A: In 1970, I first moved to Los Angeles because my best friend, Mary Wilson of The Supremes lived here. Mary opened me up to a world unknown to me of famous celebrities and helped me fulfill my dreams to be a singer and an actress. Little did I know that teaching would be my true inspiration after I was given the opportunity at Lee Strasberg Institute.

Q: Who are some celebrities with which you have worked? A: Tiffany Haddish ('Girls Trip'), Brad Pitt (I coached him on his role in 'Thelma & Louise'), Heather Locklear ('Dynasty/Melrose Place' days!), Mariska Hargitay ('Law and Order'), Kyle Chandler (as a young student and then on to 'Bloodline,' 'Friday Night Lights,' etc.). I coached Halle Berry on a few of her iconic film roles.

Q: Why did you write the book?



A: People are always referencing my first book and while that is an amazing book for actors, I have evolved so much as a teacher. I have realized that actors need to understand themselves before they can step into the life of a character. My book, 'F*ck Your Comfort Zone' is all about helping people in finding their power and being the lead in their own life!

Q: Who is this book for? What would be your advice for those who want to get out of their comfort zone?

A: 'FYCZ' is the vehicle to start your journey to become the best version of yourself letting go of control, getting out of your comfort zone, removing yourself from the drama triangle, lowering the voices of the Critical Parent, Fearful Child, and raising the voices of your Playful Child and your Nurturing Parent. And as we get older, appreciate being present so our days get longer and are filled with serenity and joy. This book is for everyone who wants to grow and become the best

> version of themselves. It doesn't make a difference how old you are. It is never too old to grow. The first step is the willingness to acknowledge that your comfort zone is not serv-

ing you. Acknowledgment is a victory. Then you can take an action, which will get you out of neutral, and lastly, acceptance of your limitations and of those you love.

Q: What is your favorite part of the book?

A: Getting out of the drama queen triangle. I tend to go into the Rescuer very easily. An example of this for me was when I adopted my son at birth. I was 44 and he was my whole world. I wanted to give him the moon and instead, I enabled him. I didn't have the tools to cut my umbilical cord. I remember when he was 3 years old, and we passed a toy store, he had a tantrum in the street, and I ran into the store and bought him the Batman toy. That was the first point of my drama queen triangle – the Rescuer. But it's easy to swirl around in all three corners of RESCUER/PERSECU-TOR/VICTIM triangle with no way to escape. But there is a way. I needed to get into my Adult – the observing mind, not the emotional reactions.

Now I have realistic expectations. I am grateful to hear his voice and so happy when he watches a Celtics basketball game with me. I accept his silence. I accept and love him.

Q: What are 2-3 tips to help people become more present, lead in their own life, and experience greater happiness?

A: 1. Detach with kindness.



Craig T. Nelson

Most of us remember Craig T. Nelson, now 78, for his most notable acting role as Hayden Fox in the highly successful TV sitcom "Coach." By the time the show appeared in 1989 and ran for eight years, Nelson had already established himself as a career actor on the small and large screens, and as a standup comic.

His biggest roles in some 34 movies include Deputy Warden



Wilson in the 1980 film "Stir

Crazy," as Steve Freeling in the 1982 film "Poltergeist," as Peter Dellaplane in "Action Jackson," as Chief Howard Hyde in "Turner & Hooch," and the warden in "My Name is Earl."

Among his more than three dozen TV appearances are his roles as Zeek Braverman in the "Parenthood" series, and as the voice in "The Incredibles" and its sequel.

Of all his numerous acting awards, however, none are as impressive as those he received for "Coach:"

Wash., on April 4, 1944, the son of Vera Margaret, a dancer, and Armand G. Nelson, a businessman. He attended Lewis and Clark High School where he played football, baseball, and basketball.

After flunking out of Central Washington University, he attended Yakima Valley College where he was inspired to study acting by his drama teacher, Mr. Brady. He then enrolled at the University of Arizona on a scholarship to study drama.

Emmy Award as Outstanding Lead Actor in a Comedy Series, Golden Globe award as Best Lead Actor in a Television Series - Comedy or Musical, American Television award as Best Actor in a Situation Comedy, and Viewers for Quality Television award as Best Actor in a Quality Comedy Series.

> In 1969, he dropped out of school and moved to Hollywood to pursue an acting career but needed to support himself initially by working in a variety of jobs, including a security guard at a soap factory.

Nelson finally found a job as a comedy writer which inspired him to become a comedian. He was an early member of The Groundlings improv and sketch comedy troupe which appeared at The Comedy Store





On The Road Again

Read the Sign: 'Gone Fishing!'

Think about it: while anglers from all over the country yearn to drop their hooks and sinkers into California waters, local fisherman can simply pack their poles into their vehicles, tackle the traffic (pardon the pun), and arrive in just a few minutes at a nearby lake, ocean pier or charter boat dock.

In Southern California especially, the fishing scene is action-packed. Just ask the hundreds of sports fishermen and women who can be found taking advantage of the yearround ideal weather and huge bounty of species waiting to bite your bait, from tuna, halibut, and rockfish to marlin, bass, and even lobster.

If you are targeting tuna, now is the time to head to the deep Pacific waters where Yellowfin, Bluefin and Albacore varieties abound, many weighing as much as 200 pounds. Fishing aficionados warn that tuna fishing requires a great deal of strength and savvy but will be well worth the effort.

Tuna might be the exotic trophy many anglers want, but the favorite species in these parts is the Yellowtail Amberjack. You'll find these gorgeous fish around reefs and wrecks in deep waters from now through August, and the experts tell us that there is an ample supply of all sizes for all ages of pole holders.



The spring and months also are ideal for hunting halibut which are caught in abundance all along the southern Pacific Coast.

Fishing Methods

Not only are there incredible amounts of fish to be found, but there are also many ways to do it. How you fish is up to you, your preferences, and your time. Here are some choices:

From a Kayak

Kayak fishing has become very popular in recent years as families enjoy the state's calm lakes and bays. Some of the best spots for doing it include Dana Point and Newport Beach.



From a Pier

Like death and taxes, you can be certain that there will be a pier near you along the So-Cal Coast, from Santa Barbara south of San Diego. Pier fishing is most popular among beginners, retired folks who just want to enjoy the scenery while hoping for a bite on their lines, and those who avoid the expense of fishing licenses and charter boats.

With Spears

For the more adventurous types, spearfishing has become one of the fastest-growing sports in the region. The reasons? The waters are clear, and training is available along with professional 'scouts' who can identify the best places to find your prey underwater (Catalina is recommended destination for Southern California anglers.) A variety of species can be found, but the Spiny Lobster is off-limits, say the experts.



From a Boat

Take it from me, there's nothing like fishing on a boat. While you feel the gentle sway of the waves under you and your line is thrown off the side, the anticipation of the next catch is intoxicating. There's also a sense of camaraderie among your fellow boatmates.

But the most valuable benefit of deep-water fishing is the availability of experts on board, especially if you are a beginner. Experienced charter captains know where the species of fish congregate, and they know the law.

Whether you are on a fourhour party boat excursion or fishing hundreds of miles from land, fishing guides are usually locals who have spent most of their lives on the water, so their insights are invaluable.




Licensing

In California, anyone age 16 and above is required to get a sport fishing license to take any fish; shellfish, reptile, or amphibian. It is intended to protect the fish populations. The only exception is for fishing from a public pier in ocean waters. Also, the state offers two free fishing days each year that allow anglers to try sport fishing without getting a license. You can check The California Department of Fish and Wildlife website for those dates.

One thing is for sure, fishing in Southern California is an outdoors experience you'll cherish for the rest of your life. Who knows? You might even catch your next meal.











comedy world, explaining that "the standup comedy life was pretty unfulfilling for me." His next move was retreating to a more sedate environment in Montgomery Creek, Calif. where he lived in "contentment, like "The Waltons" without electricity or running water.

Life After Mother



Compassion, Choices, and Courage

My mother often expressed her support for the right of terminal patients to end their own lives, sometimes saying she'd want that for herself. She was even a supporter of Compassion & Choices, a non-profit organization that advocates for terminal patients' right to self-administer lethal drugs legally.

When the end of her own life loomed ever larger, however, the deeper into denial she went. Even if she'd been more courageous and honest about her declining health, she wouldn't have met the criteria that California's End of Life Option Act (EOLOA) requires.



California allows terminal patients to request drugs from a doctor to end their lives. The patients must meet the following criteria: they must have six months to live as determined by a doctor, they must receive permission to self-administer lethal drugs from two physicians, they must be mentally capable, and they must request the drugs twice (15 days orig-



inally, changed to 48 hours recently), and they must be able to self-administer the drugs.

For neither my mother nor father, no doctor ever gave them less than six months to live. One doctor gave my father, who was dying of cancer, three to five years to live, another doctor told him, one year. I was no doctor, but I knew those estimates were overly generous. He was gone a few months after those estimates were given.

Dementia, a common term for memory loss, was what my mother was diagnosed with, but she was never diagnosed with its most common form, Alzheimer's. Whatever the condition may be labeled, it's a particularly controversial aspect of a patient's options for end-of-life care. By the time, a patient with Alzheimer's or dementia is given six months to live, the patient's mental capability is no longer sound.

I was present when a doctor told my mother, about a month before her death, that her condition would last indefinitely. I asked for a timeframe. The doctor looked at my mother and proclaimed, 'For the rest of your life!' Neither she nor I asked how long that might be.

I sometimes wonder if the doctors didn't discuss a timeline of six months or less out of reluctance to perhaps deal with a right-to-die situation. My mother's HMO has a web page that provides information about the EOLOA and states that a patient may explore this option, but how willing staffers may be to discuss this option may be another matter.




Sometimes when my mother ranted about a right-to-die law, I'd get pragmatic and tell her she didn't need any law, she could just jump off a cliff. Terminal patients, though, deserve better choices than that. This is where a living will, a Physician's Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment, and/or a power of attorney allow a patient and the patient's relatives some control, whether or not a legal end-of-life option applies.

Soon we heard what we thought was some chirping and my wife quietly snuck out with her camera to the deck to snap some photos which are attached to this article.

I am astounded at the dedication of both parents. Momma was sitting so long and quietly on the nest taking care of her babies while Daddy was flying back and forth bringing food. Strong winds didn't send Momma scrambling for cover as I saw gusts shaking the umbrella which made me worry that maybe the whole table would be blown over. It's astounding when you think of how dedicated these birds are to protecting their young. As I write this, the parents continue to work very hard each doing their part. What dedication!

Tinseltown Talks

60s Pop singer Donna Loren Traded Fame for Family

When a top female British singer declined to appear on the premiere episode of the new American musical variety show "Shindig!" on Sept. 16, 1964, the producer knew who to call - Donna Loren.

"Dusty Springfield couldn't make the first show, so I was invited to sing her hit 'Wishin' and 'Hopin' and became a regular cast member for the rest of the series," said Loren, who turned 75 in March, from her home in Bisbee, Ariz.

Loren had already impressed American television audiences six years earlier with stunning performances guest-starring as a child singing prodigy on "The Mickey Mouse Club."

By 1963, she was also gaining nationwide recognition as the model and spokesperson for the Dr Pepper Co., performing at promotional events across the country since the age of 16. In films, she appeared in two 1964 musical comedies, "Muscle Beach Party" and "Bikini Beach," with a third, "Pajama"

Party," released shortly after her first "Shindig!" appearance. All three films starred beloved former lead Mouseketeer, Annette Funicello.

With film, television, advertising, and song contracts before her, the dark-haired beauty with a killer voice seemed poised to take the 60s entertainment world by storm, even acting on popular shows such as "Batman," "The Monkees," and "Gomer Pyle: USMC." An additional beach film, "Beach Blanket Bingo," was released in 1965 featuring Loren's signature song, "It Only Hurts When I Cry."

But by 1969, Donna had large-

ly vanished from the entertainment scene.

"Privately, my life growing up had been difficult," she admitted. "My mother had me out of wedlock and was mired in shame back in the 1940s. She didn't want me and didn't even like me which I've had to

try to balance all my life."

Loren married in 1968, at the age of 21, as her 5-year contract with Dr Pepper was coming to an end. But then, tragedy struck her new family.

"Two months after the wedding my mother-in-law passed away suddenly," she explained. "I'd had the contract with Dr Pepper since I was 16 and on my 21st birthday they wanted me to fly to the company headquarters in Dallas to perform for the executives."

Around this time, with all her earnings going straight to her parents, she also became pregnant.

"I knew the Dr Pepper CEO,

Foots Clements, so I called him to say I was getting out of the business," she said. "I did not want to be used anymore and I needed my child to know who I was. I have absolutely no regrets about the decision."

Loren went on to raise several children and remarried. After 40 years of private life and with her family grown, she began recording and performing again in the late 2000s.

With numerous singles and CDs released in the past decade, she even relearned 100 songs she had performed in the 60s, posting many online for fans. If Loren had any doubts about recording after a prolonged absence, the words of "Mickey Mouse Club" teen idol Funicello confirmed her self-confidence.

"I still remember my appearance on the show and Annette later sending me a Christmas card in which she wrote: 'I wish I could sing like you!" recalled Loren, whose still-powerful vocal perfor-

mances are cataloged on her website (www.donnaloren.com).

Loren has been recounting her life and career recently on a series of weekly podcasts titled "Love is a Secret Weapon" co-hosted by Dr. Adam Gerace (see www.anchor.fm/lovesa-secretweaponpodcast).

"I love communicating with people," she says. "Give me a minute and I'll give you my all."

Intensive Aphasia Therapy: A Different Approach

Located in Anaheim, CA is a small speech therapy practice called Instrumental SLP, founded by Lyda Kongswangwongsa, an ASHA Certified Speech Language Pathologist (CCC SLP). It could be any other small speech therapy private practice, except for two big differences. The first difference is that Instrumental SLP specializes in adult speech therapy. Most private practices offer services mainly for children, but adults have different needs and problems to address. Adults really need someone who specializes in speech therapy for adults. The second difference is that it offers the only Intensive Comprehensive Aphasia Program in California or the West Coast.

Intensive Comprehensive Aphasia Programs (ICAPs) are programs for people who have aphasia. Aphasia is a language disorder that can happen after a brain injury or stroke and over 2 million people in the United States have aphasia. There are a handful of other ICAPs located across the country, many of them are big programs at universities or hospitals.

When asked why she thought she should offer this program, she says her "clients just wanted more". She also wanted to give more. Traditional speech therapy is typically a 45 minute session 2-3 times a week. When Lyda would treat people with aphasia, she always felt like having more time with them would give better results. But working as an employee

you have to meet certain billing and productivity requirements, so there was little opportunity to explore this.

In 2020 Lyda founded her company, Instrumental SLP, after working for seven years in hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, subacute rehab centers, and home health companies in Southern California. Lyda wanted to provide longer sessions using research based therapies designed to improve the abilities of those with aphasia. ICAPs typically offer several hours of speech therapy a day, several days a week, for up to several weeks at a time. Some of the really big programs in the U.S. even do programs lasting for 6 weeks at a time. Lyda says her program isn't ready for that just yet, but she is building up to that capacity.

As far as her clients are concerned, Lyda says the progress she has seen since beginning these programs is substantial. "ICAPs are for people who want to see the most improvement possible in a short amount of time. People get tired of waiting for results, and with this format we get the intensity required for learning and neuroplasticity. This helps us achieve the best results possible for the deficits that are present. We test at the beginning and end of the programs so we can measure success. Everyone we saw last year showed clear improvement."

ICAP sessions are held 4 days per week and last for 3-4 hours

each day. Clients must meet program requirements in order to participate in ICAP, but Lyda tailors each program based on what the client will benefit most from. "Some people struggle with maintaining their attention and by the 4th hour they aren't getting anything from the sessions. So when possible, we modify each program so that our client isn't forced to attend sessions longer than they can benefit from." They aren't always able to do this, but Lyda says she enjoys giving her cli ents the best program they can design.

Lyda says she also works with clients who have the ability to communicate with only mild deficits, but she wants help getting ready to communicate at high levels. Specifically they want to prepare to return to work, so in therapy they work on practicing all the different scenarios someone might face like communicating with superiors or having hard conversations at work with employees. Lyda says she has even helped people who want to be able return to work using Java and Javascript coding languages. "I am not a coder, but I can walk someone through the necessary steps to be able to better understand symbols or languages. My job is to help them find out what they need help with, and to show them how to implement different tools to ease their transition back to work."

Lyda says wants people with aphasia to feel empowered in

You can't travel far in the state without seeing plenty of homegrown favorites. California takes second place after Florida as the biggest cultivator of oranges in the USA.



"I'm not about lionizing Elvis," says Australian director/producer/ writer Baz Luhrmann, the driving force behind the forthcoming big-budget "Elvis" biopic. "I just saw him as the best canvas on which to explore America in the modern age, the '50s, '60s, and '70s. I saw the story of the Colonel and Elvis as a great prism through which to explore the latter part of the 20th century."

Best known for his 2013 feature "The Great Gatsby," Luhrmann has shouldered the task of bringing (back) to life the groundbreaking king of early Rock 'n Roll music.

We first meet the future megastar as a poor southern boy, played by 14-year-old Australian actor Chaydon Jay. He sets the stage for the adult Elvis, portrayed just about perfectly by former child actor Austin Butler, recently seen as Manson murderer Charles "Tex" Watson in "Once Upon a Time in Hollywood."

Over the years, numerous biopics have covered the life stories of many early Rock legends, including Ray Charles, Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens, Bobby Darin, and Tina Turner. But none of these artists, talented and popular as they may have been, came close to matching the worldwide impact of Elvis Aron Presley.

Luhrmann's offering focuses on

the final two decades of Presley's life and career, as well as the tumultuous relationship he endured with Andreas van Kruijk, an illegal immigrant from Holland who called himself "Colonel" Tom Parker. Through barely recognizable Tom Hanks, we come to know the dark side and sheer ruthlessness of the carnival barker-turned-hustler music promoter who steered Presley to international celebrity. At one point, Parker tells the future icon, "We are the same, you and I. We are two odd, lonely children reaching for eternity."

Parker smoothed out Elvis's rough edges (so important to his early persona and fame) and goaded and guided him through vacuous movies with insipid soundtracks before Presley returned to live performances for adoring Las Vegas audiences.

California native Butler, adamant about performing Elvis's hits onscreen, began voice coaching a year before filming started. It's Austin that you hear doing the early material; as the story unfolds, Butler's vocals are blended with the original later recordings.

"Elvis" was filmed primarily in Queensland, Australia, but does offer a glimpse of Graceland where, on Aug. 16, 1977, Presley expired on an upstairs bathroom floor.

It is all done through a bar that comes up out of the scale and sends and measures low-voltage electrical currents through the body via electrodes. Don't worry, the manufacturers assure us that it is safe and dependable.

Visitors to CES couldn't help but notice the "buzz" when they heard the "ring" on Apple Watch's new NightWatch Orb.

The nifty gadget magnifies the watch's display to effectively turn




